**Goodwill's Citywide E-Waste Event: One City. One Goal. One Event.
Collects More Than 10 Tons of E-Waste**

LONG BEACH, CALIF. – JUNE 28, 2007 – Goodwill, Serving the People of Southern Los Angeles County, the City of Long Beach and its residents recycled 10.5 tons of E-Waste at the Long Beach Citywide E-Waste Recycling Event this past Saturday, June 23rd.

The 4-hour collection drive held at Houghton Park in North Long Beach and at California State University, Long Beach's (CSULB) parking lot succeeded in diverting 21,021 pounds of electronics (televisions, computer monitors, cell phones and other items). The citywide effort drew 310 donors and of the total pounds recycled; 13,119 consisted of monitors and televisions; 2,341 of computer CPU's and 5,561 pounds of assorted e-scrap.
